Searches

You may search the database by entering terms in the search box labeled "find a file." Meta data, where available and populated, is stored on:

Date of Letter (date Patent Letter was signed and submitted)
Patent Number
Referenced Standards
Submitter
ANSI Accredited Standards Developer acronym

Once a list from the Search is compiled, to view the information for each entry:

Click on the title of the standard/project, it is possible to view a copy of the patent letter in PDF format.

You may also sort the database by date of the patent letter.

Additional Comments regarding the ANSI Patent Database

Some of the ANSI-Accredited Standards Developers (ASDs) have supplied ANSI with URLs¹ to their own online Patent Databases. When this is the case, a separate record within the Patent Database in PDF format is posted that will link externally to the respective developer's database.
