2.2 ISO Strategic Advisory Group (SAG) on Smart Farming

Executive summary:

ANSI and DIN, the German national organization for standardization, will co-lead the ISO Strategic Advisory Group (SAG) on Smart Farming, which was created to help address increasing pressure on the food chain from global challenges such as climate change, population growth, and risk from pandemics.

What is Smart Farming?

Smart farming refers to the modern use of Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) in agriculture. Smart farming stands for the networking of food production. The networking requires the information from the first production process of the food to be transferred, through to grocery retail.

Within ISO, there are numerous standards-development committees that are either already working on — or will soon be involved in — the technological developments happening in their individual fields that are connected to the subjects of smart farming and sustainable food production. As part of its mandate, the new SAG on smart farming will look for synergies and opportunities in existing work, within ISO, as well as identifying any gaps.

The main deliverable of the new SAG is expected to be a smart farming standardization roadmap, to be presented to the ISO TMB at its September 2022 meeting. Over the course of the next year, the SAG will advance its work virtually via Zoom meetings. SAG members will determine additional details about how the SAG will work.

2.3 Summary of Voting Results on Recent ISO Ballots (Informational Report) 2:05 PM TO 2:30 PM

1) ISO Proposal (proposer – Japan): Advertising and marketing to children

Background

Executive summary

The ISO New Work Item Proposal ballot closed in July 2021. This proposal for a new standard on *Guidance for Advertising and Marketing Affecting Children* did not pass the ISO National Standard Bodies vote. **Therefore, this project will not be moving forward in ISO.**

2) ISO Systematic Review: ISO 26000, Guidance on Social Responsibility

Background

Executive summary

To understand whether there was consensus among National Standard Bodies to establish a new Technical Committee (TC) to revise ISO 26000, a third systematic review of ISO 26000 was launched in mid-October 2020. When the systematic review balloting period closed (March 2021), the voting results showed no consensus on the need to revise ISO 26000 (note: two previous systematic reviews resulted in confirming ISO 26000 as is without revision).

Based on the voting results, the ISO Technical Management Board decided to reject the proposal to establish a TC on social responsibility at its June 2021 TMB meeting.

The ISO TMB will consider future risks and opportunities in social responsibility-related work raised by its task group. In the meantime, the 2010 edition of ISO 26000 has been confirmed by Member Body vote on the Systematic Review.

3) COPOLCO Consultation: Safety and performance of menstrual products

Background

Executive summary

In May 2021, ISO COPOLCO launched a Consultation Ballot to determine whether there was enough support to add this project to its WG 4 (Product Safety) program of work. The result of the consultation ballot indicated that there is sufficient support to proceed with this initiative. COPOLCO WG 4 will review the results and provide the recommended next steps for this project.

An estimated 300 million people use some sort of menstrual products every day. Indeed, approximately 9 billion people worldwide are potential users of these products. Unfortunately, no standards exist on an international level for determining the safety, performance, and fitness-for-purpose of manufactured menstrual products.

Note: Sweden (SIS) is the proposer for this project but has acknowledged that they would not be able to lead the future Technical/Project committee due to funding limitations.

4) COPOLCO Consultation: Products and services information for consumers

Background

Executive summary

In September 2021, ISO COPOLCO launched a Consultation Ballot to determine whether there was enough support to add this project to its WG 18 (Consumer issues in services) program of work. The result of the consultation ballot indicated that there is sufficient support to proceed with this initiative. COPOLCO WG 18 will review the results and provide the recommended next steps for this project.

Scope:

Standardization in the field of products and services information for consumers. It includes online and offline information. Excluded:

- consumer guarantees and warranties,
- · online terms and conditions,
- preparation of instructions for use,
- privacy information covered by ISO/IEC/JTC1/SC27 and ISO/PC 317,
- sector-specific projects developed in other relevant ISO committees.

Note: China (SAC) is the proposer for this project.
