2.1	Update on the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership Agreement (TTIP).

10:10 – 10:45 am	Executive summary:
	The next round of TTIP negotiations will take place September 29 – October 3 rd in Washington, DC. A USTR speaker has been invited to brief the IPC on recent developments, and more details will be provided following the negotiations.
	Recommended IPC action: To listen and provide input into the development of a set of key messaging points related to standards to be used to educate and influence industry and other stakeholder participations in the ANSI-ESO MOU as well as the TTIP process.
2.2	Report on the August 2014 ANSI meetings with the European Standards Organizations (ESOs) (Ms. Hitchcock)
10:45 – 11:15 am	Executive summary: The ANSI-ESO meeting took place on August 27, 2014 in Washington, DC. Representatives from the ESOs were present along with ANSI staff and IPC task group members. During the course of the meeting, ANSI and the ESOs discussed cooperation opportunities. The points below include the mutually agreed upon items as a result of the August meeting.
	 ANSI and the ESOs: Reaffirmed our commitment to continue our dialogue and seek opportunities for cooperative engagement, rather than focus on the MOU at this time. We agreed to focus on: seeking better ways to share information on proposed regulatory requirements and participation in standards making activities for the benefit of European and U.S. industry stakeholders developing a process to identify issues, topics, and technologies which would benefit from a Transatlantic standards panel that would bring the stakeholders together to explore standardization opportunities exploring possible methods and processes to create transatlantic standards Next steps: Respond to each other's list of questions: October 30, 2014 Establish a joint task group to define the proposed transatlantic standards panel process (item 2b above) Have further dialogues with industry to better define potential future, joint standardization issues Agree to meet on February 9-10, 2015 in London Recommended IPC action: To note the process and outcomes as stated above and to discuss the items of cooperation. [<i>Note: The IPC will receive the draft ANSI written responses to the list of questions received by the ESOs by October 10.</i>] The final action is to approve the responses to the list of questions so that they may be sent to the ESOs by October 30, 2014.
