	Ms. Lindsay will engage in an interactive discussion with the members of the CIF, on behalf of the InterNational Committee for Information Technology Standards (INCITS EB), in order to get a better sense of consumer priorities and link them to specific ISO and IEC Joint Technical Committees (JTC 1) that are in need of the consumer viewpoint. Note: During this session, specific examples of projects under development within JTC 1 Subcommittees 27, 41, and 42 will be discussed.
	The INCITS Executive Board is the primary U.S. focus of standardization in the field of Information and Communications Technologies (ICT), encompassing storage, processing, transfer, display, management, organization, and retrieval of information. As such, INCITS also serves as ANSI's Technical Advisory Group for ISO/IEC Joint Technical Committee 1. JTC 1 is responsible for International standardization in the field of Information Technology.



JTC 1 is comprised of 22 subcommittees (see below).

Input from CIF members and other concerned US stakeholders were compiled in June 2020 and used to formulate the ANSI position and comments on the below ISO Proposals, which were presented to the ANSI ISO Council, for approval to be submitted to ISO. See the status updates for these ISO Proposals below.

1) ISO New Proposal on Managing Risk for Youth and School Trips'

Status Update (Reference doc: ANSI CIF 20-020)

The proposal for this new Project Committee (PC) is being held for final decision at the September 28, 30 and October 1 ISO Technical Management Board (TMB) meeting. Some TMB members had some small concerns with setting up this new PC.

2) ISO New Proposal on Child care articles

Status Update (Reference doc: ANSI CIF 20-021)

This Technical Committee (TC) proposal was approved and the new TC will move forward. However, the secretariat (France) wishes to use the same number for this new TC as the current PC developing the standard on baby strollers. Therefore, ANFOR wants to complete that standard first before starting the TC in order to avoid any confusion over ISO having a PC and a TC with the same number. The new TC is expected to start in 2021.

3) ISO New Proposal on Social responsibility

Status Update Reference doc: (ANSI CIF 20-023)
