Ms. Griffin and Ms. Saunders will provide an overview of recent activities relating to standards incorporated by reference (IBR'd) into federal and state regulations. Among other things, they will address: (i) recent court cases, both U.S. and international, that have eroded copyright protection for certain IBR'd standards and other lawsuits on the horizon that may result in even further expansion of "fair use" rights for IBR'd standards; (2) possible legislative solutions that are being explored by some members of ANSI to shore up copyright protection in IBR'd standards; (iii) ANSI's ongoing work with federal and state governments to educate interested parties about OMB's historic approach on copyright protection for IBR'd standards; (iv) current efforts underway to contribute to the public discourse on IBR so as to ensure both sides of the IBR debate are being addressed and understood by stakeholders, legislators and the public; and (v) thoughts and recommendations about how SDOs might look at their own current and future business models in light of the changing IBR landscape.
