Please comment on any issues of significance which might have an impact upon materially affected or interested U.S. parties.</p> <p>An Ad Hoc Group was formed during the plenary meeting to support developing a Technical Report on mm-wave power density measurement. It will take 4 – 6 weeks for IEC central office to formalize this and inform NCs to invite experts to join the group. IEC requires a first meeting (conference call is acceptable) to be held within 12 weeks from the date the group was form (November 4th, 2016).</p> <p>Japan questioned the deletion of medical implant exclusion text relating to the wireless power transfer (WPT) TR in WG9 and wants the deleted exclusion restored. Switzerland clarified that this is related to RF exposure enhancement caused by medical implants in the human body due to external fields from WPT devices and unrelated to exposures induced directly by medical implants. WG-9 has sent inquiry to ICNIRP regarding this and is waiting for a response, which may not come until ICNIRP decision on revising its limits has been finalized. The deleted medical implant exclusion will be restored and exposure concerns for RF exposure enhancement due to medical implants will be reviewed when a response from ICNIRP is received.</p>
