

All reports from committees were provided without any contentious issues for the US. Areas of specific interest were as follows:

#### (1) SC 23 B

Agree to study DC requirements within IEC SC 23 B maintenance teams for Plugs, Socket-Outlets and Switches to cover DC Accessories. This effort will be closely followed as development is started within the maintenance teams. This will lead to potential new products including plugs, connectors, receptacles, and switches for DC applications.

Also agreed to form maintenance teams of 23 B to cover IEC 60906-1 and IEC 60906-2 for plugs and socket-outlets. These groups will be formed once maintenance work is started.

Important to note the US requested that the prior committee leadership of 23C MT-2 be considered for the new MT of 23B for IEC 60906-2 Plugs and Socket Outlets for Household and similar Purposes –Part 2: Plugs and Socket Outlets 15 and 20 Amp 125 V a.c. and 20 A 125 V a.c. electrical accessories.. This is to ensure continuity of the work in maintenance of IEC 60906-2.
