#### 1.2 Approval of Agenda

## Section 4 Presentation by Ms Carol Herman, Senior Vice President, Standards Policy & Programs, Association for the Advancement of Medical Instrumentation (AAMI)

Ms Herman reported that AAMI's 2015-2017 Strategic Plan prioritizes the goal of "transforming the standards development process to increase agility, quality, and relevance." She outlined this goal – how it became so important to the organization – and the approach and timeline for completing this significant project. This includes incorporation of supply chain and life-cycle considerations, new tools and processes to accommodate the increasing pace of technology, and utilizing new formats for usability, ease of understanding and use, and delivery of standards. Under Goal 3: Standards the following action items were highlighted:

- (3.1) Expand the scope of AAMI's standards program to encompass the life cycle and supply chain of healthcare technology.
- (3.2) Identify and implement new tactics for global harmonization of standards.
- (3.3) Develop and implement new tools and processes to accommodate the increasing pace of technology innovation in healthcare.

• (3.4) Apply state-of-the art tools to enhance understanding, usability, and delivery of standards content. (ATTACHMENT C)

## Section 5 The IEC Young Professionals Program – 2015, Ms Carin Stuart, Senior Technology Engineer, Energizer Holdings, Inc., and Mr Ryan Franks, Technical Program Manager, NEMA

Ms Carin Stuart and Mr Ryan Franks, two of the USNC's 2014 Young Professionals, join the Council's meeting by teleconference and, unfortunately, the third, Mr Kevin Mangold, was not available. They shared with its members their thoughts and reactions after having attended the Tokyo IEC General Meeting in November. Each expressed their appreciation for this opportunity and noted how much they anticipated networking with the IEC community for around the world.

Ms Stuart provided the following feedback:

- 1) My highlights for the workshop were:
  - a. attending the SMB meeting this has historically seemed to be a very closed door meeting and it was interesting to see a portion of the meeting to understand the dynamics of the discussions.
  - b. having breakfast with an IEC Chair I learned a lot from the discussion at the breakfast table with the Chair of TC111 and his perspective on the IEC and his committee.
  - c. networking with others from around the world it was extremely interesting to see the IEC through the eyes of people with very different backgrounds.
- 2) I agree with Ryan that for the amount of involvement we have had in the IEC to date, there was a lot of basic information that we already knew going into the workshop. One piece of feedback I offered at the end was to perhaps have 2 tracks 1) which is for more advanced YPs and 2) for those who have had little to no involvement to date. Perhaps they could offer a few different options during the workshop so it is not overly repetitive.

#### Mr Franks highlighted the following points:

- 1) I was impressed by the level of organization and the thought that went into planning the event. It was great that so many top IEC people were able to participate.
- 2) The most important thing that happened might be the personal relationship formed. We can all carry our shared experience forward and who knows it is likely that at some point down the road I will be interacting with one or more of the attendees. They have already emailed me for US-related help.
- 3) Speaking strictly for myself, I thought I knew a lot of the information that was presented. I realize that some of the attendees were very new to IEC operations, but I am already involved in a number of IEC committees and serve as a convenor. I think it may be useful to have two or

more tracts or tiers of information based on the level of experience of the attendee.

4) I would suggest rebranding the IEC YP program in the US so that it reads as more of an award than a training workshop. This suggestion is a result of it being difficult to justify overseas travel to attend a workshop to management not familiar with IEC. Suggested language might be something along the lines of "Carin Stuart was selected to represent the US as an IEC Young Professional."

## Section 6 Standardization Management Board (SMB) and Other Technical Issues – Mr Alec McMillan, USNC VP – Technical and Chair – TMC, Rockwell Automation

Mr McMillan reported on the activities resulting from the Tokyo SMB meeting and on the TMC meeting held in Round Rock on 28 January. He highlighted the following USNC TMC Strategic Focus for 2015:

  - d. Align International activities with ANSI –ISO agenda and activities where ever possible
- (d) Government
  - a. Pursue interface with state department on ITU strategy and coexistence with USNC
  - b. Invite USTR to update USNC TMC on regional issues on their radar screen

## Section 7 Restructuring of the President's Task Force on Conformity Assessment Systems Timothy T Duffy, Chair, CAPCC, Rockwell Automation

Mr. Duffy reported on the status of CAPCC's recommendation that the President's Task Force on Conformity Assessment Systems be restructured as a CAPCC Standing Subcommittee responsible for overseeing the Operating Procedures of each of the USNC Systems and ensuring that they are consistent, uniform and that each contain the essential elements required of all CA Systems operating under the umbrella of the USNC. CAPCC is currently considering the draft Terms of Reference of a

#### **Section 8** Conformity Assessment Policy Coordination Committee (CAPCC)

Mr. Duffy briefly highlighted the results of the Tuesday, 27 January 2015 CAPCC meeting held at Dell and plans for the next CAB meeting to be held in June in Geneva. He highlighted the following:

  on conformity assessment issues primarily dealing with accreditation. CAPCC expressed the
  belief that there were other CA issues that could be of interest to both ANSI and the USNC.
- Reports from the Systems including progress reports on strategic objectives. Initiated
  discussion of the financial situation facing the USNC as challenged by the ANSI Board.
  CAPCC should be contributing some amount to the USNC based on the resources that are used
  for the CAPCC and Systems.
- Reviewed the IEC/Council's discussion/vote on CAB reorganization that took place at the Tokyo General Meeting.
- Kevin Robinson, OSHA, updated his report on NRTL Program and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Stakeholders meeting that took place on 22 October 2014.
- Gary Schrempp, Dell, updated his reports on:
  - QR Code and e-Labeling CAPCC discussed cooperation with trade associations to generate support.
  - India conformity assessment issues
- Reviewed the Decisions/Elections from CAB meeting held in Tokyo noting the increase in membership and automatically appointed members.
- Noted membership on CAB WGs, Invitation for Nominations for 1906 Award and soon to be issued invitation for nominations for the Thomas A Edison Award.
- Jim Walters, Air-Conditioning, Heating and Refrigeration Institute (AHRI) provided an update on Middle East/Africa region and efforts to establish the Air-Conditioning and Refrigeration Association of Manufacturers of the Middle East and North Africa (ARAMENA).
- Update on the GCC Standardization Organization GSO Regional CA Regulatory Scheme

- Gene Eckhart, NEMA, provided an update on CA issues in the Americas
- Agreed to prepare USNC proposal for June CAB meeting on the issue of Impartiality of IEC Contract Assessors in Conduct Peer Assessments.
- Heard report on planned FINCA 2015 meeting in Colombia.
- Working to activate CAPCC Task Force on Conformity Assessment Communications. Need for Chair announced. Noted treatment of CA in Winter 2015 issue of **USNC Current**.

#### 8.1 Status Report – USNC/IECRE

Mr Margis reported on and highlighted the following:

- The USNSC CAPCC Task Force on IECRE successfully closed the books on the Inaugural REMC Meeting held in Boulder, CO and hosted by the USNC. The meeting was well received and came in under budget.
- Since the REMC meeting in September, the ICERE has elected leadership for a variety of roles.
   Included from the US in these roles are: Sandy Butterfield, IECRE Chairman; Jonathan Colby, IECRE ME OMC Chairman.
- In January, the USNC/IECRE had its kickoff teleconference led by Interim Chairman Jonathan Colby. The meeting served as an opportunity to bring the entire USNC/ICERE membership up to date on the background and current activities related to IECRE. The meeting was well attended with nearly 100 attendees including observers and approximately 25 roistered members. Future meetings will be for members only. At the meeting, the USNC/IECRE Secretariat was officially named as NEMA with Joel Solis serving as the USNC/IECRE Secretary.
- Primary subjects to be resolved at the USNC/IECRE first face to face meeting scheduled for April at NEMA HQ in Roslyn, VA include:

Approval of Budget (noting that the 2016 budget and beyond will include additional fees from the IEC)

  Dubai CMC meeting to be held in JUN. Work of note includes input being developed for the
  proposed Harmonized Basic Rules submitted to systems from the CAB. The USNC/IECEE
  will develop its input and be active members of the IECEE Task Force on the subject.
  Subsequent to such input, the USNC/IECEE will share updates with the remaining USNC
  mirror committees to IEC CA.
- New areas that may be of interest include:

progress towards an IECEE Certificate Program for Motor Energy Efficiency that developed from a US proposal

operationalizing a service for functional safety following the acceptance of ICE functional safety standards within the IECEE

discussion on development of a security service for the industrial automation industry (which is recognized by the larger ICE CAB efforts related to security)

Messrs Piqueira, Williams and Matthews reported on the activities of the ANSI Board Task Group on Cost Recovery and on the related decisions made by the ANSI Board at its December 2014 meeting. They led a discussion of the affect these decisions will have on the USNC's future funding program.

Messrs Piqueira and Williams highlighted the work of the Task Group, its Charter, Summary of its Recommendations and a USNC Gap Analysis which indicates a gap @ 50% Cost Recovery of \$327,000. (ATTACHMENT F) Potential Cost Recovery Options were also highlighted and Mr Matthews outlined the following Options that need to be considered:

Option 1: Raise Dues/Fees

Option 2: Assess Fees on CA Activities

Option 3: Grow Membership

Option 4: Cut Expenses

Option 5: Other New Revenue Streams (New Alternative Proposal – New Class of Full Member)

(ATTACHMENT G)

A lengthy discussion took place and it was agreed that the USNC Finance Committee would be charge to review this entire subject and to develop recommendations by 15 April so that the Council will have time to consider them at its meeting on 21 May.

#### Section 11 Presentation by Mr Joe Bhatia, President and CEO, ANSI

Mr Bhatia provided a brief overview of a number of issues that are currently occupying the attention of the ANSI Federation. He highlighted and reported on the following:

- Congressional Update
- Workcred Overview
- ANSI Annual Report, Mobile Webstore, Standards Connect
- BTG Recommendations
- Smart Cities Update (ATTACHMENT H)

#### **Section 12 USNC Strategic Objectives Program**

Mr Piqueira reminded Council of the USNC's Strategic Objectives Program which was initiated in August 2012 at FM Approvals in Norwood, MA, under the guidance of Facilitator Mr. Bob Bellhouse. As a result of that effort, initially 5 Core Elements, related Strategic Objectives and specific Action Plans were developed and are now the subject of detailed review. Champions for each Core Element have been assigned and are now engaged in building a meaningful Strategic Program. Mr Piqueira called on each of the Champions to provide status reports.

• Core Element 1: Increasing and broadening USNC membership. (Champion: Kevin J Lippert)

In Mr Lippert's absence, Mr Zegers reported that the membership development activities of the Nominations Committee for both ANSI and the USNC membership continues but not at a fast pace. Priority time must be created for this activity. Initial contact was made by Committee members with a list of prospective USNC Members and now further action is intended by Committee Members and by Staff.

 Core Element 2: Ensuring effective marketing and communications of key USNC messages

(Champion: Elaina M Finger)

Ms Mayes, C&CEC Vice Chair, reported that the efforts of the Communications and Continuing Education Committee will be addressed in its Report to Council.

• Core Element 3: Providing for ongoing IEC and USNC leadership and succession (Philip M Piqueira)

Mr Piqueira noted that the primary emphasis of this Core Element is succession planning both at the IEC and the USNC levels. He noted that this critical task will occupy the Council over the next few years. He invited those with interest in future office to contact him.

- USNC and IEC Succession Both the USNC President and the VP-Technical are term limited after their next term as is Jim Matthews after his next term as IEC VP – SMB Chair. The Nominations Committee is actively considering potential candidates for these positions.
- An effort is underway to develop Terms of Office information for each of the positions that are under consideration.
- The election of Mr Jim Shannon as IEC President-Elect at the 2015 IEC General Meeting in Belarus is a high priority for the USNC.
- Core Element 4: Building recognition of the value proposition of standardization work by current and prospective stakeholders.
   (Alec McMillan)

Mr McMillan called attention to the report he gave earlier in the meeting. Also, it was noted that Mr Williams had withdrawn as Co-Champion for this Core Element.

 Core Element 5: Coordinating USNC positions on Electrotechnical Conformity Assessment (CA) issues which relate to, or impact, the IEC global agenda (Timothy T Duffy)

Mr Duffy reported that CAPCC is actively involved in this Strategic Planning effort and each of the Systems, IECEE, IECEx. IECQ and now IECRE, are actively involved in the process. Each of the Systems is beginning to report their Strategic Planning activities at each CAPCC meeting.

#### Section 13 Status of Planning for the USNC Hosted 2022 IEC General Meeting

Mr Margis, Chair, 2022 IEC GM Planning Committee provided a brief status report on the USNC's plan to host the 2022 General Meeting in the US. He called attention to the roster of the Committee and indicated that anyone interested in joining the Planning Committee is welcome and should advise Mr Margis, Ms Lancaster and Mr Zegers. (USNC/Council 634) (ATTACHMENT I)

## Section 14 Report on the World Standards Cooperation Roundtable Held at the University of Washington, Seattle, WA, 22 – 23 January 2015

Messrs Zegers and Zertuche provided brief reports on the WSC Roundtable which was held at the University of Washington in Seattle on 22 - 23 January 2015. Although the attendance was less than planned, the dialogue on the topic of The Role of Standardization in Innovation and Entrepreneurship was aggressive and worthwhile.

## Section 15 Nominations Committee (Kevin J Lippert, Chair)

Mr Lippert called into the meeting and highlighted the following:

15.1 Report of the Nominations Committee Teleconference of 24 November 2014 and the Results of Council E-Ballot 73 and USNC E-Ballot 23 which had to do with the election of USNC Officers and Council Members.

Mr Lippert noted that by this endorsement Honorary Life Membership was approved for:

- John W Young and
- Bernie Liebler

#### 15.2 Succession Plan for USNC and IEC Positions Over the Next Several Years

Mr Lippert called attention to the Succession Plan that is being maintained by the Nominations Committee (USNC/Council 649) (ATTACHMENT J) He noted that a number of positions in both the USNC and IEC are under term limits and anyone interested in these positions should make their interest known.

#### 15.3 Terms of Reference for USNC President – Elect and Plan for Implementation

Mr Lippert noted that with Mr Piqueira having only some 2 ½ years remaining on his term, consideration must be given to a successor. Therefore, the USNC procedure for electing a President-Elect is important. (USNC/Council 646) (ATTACHMENT K) It was suggested that the Nominations Committee review this document for possible revision.

#### 15.4 Action Plan for 2015 Awards Programs

Mr Lippert called attention to the various Awards Programs, USNC, ANSI and IEC, and indicated that an effort will be initiated to invite nominations as early as possible.

#### 15.5 Consumer Advocate Position on USNC Council

Mr Zegers reported that Dr JoAnn Emmel has retired from the University of Virginia and her travel support from the ANSI Consumer Interest Forum is in question. Therefore, an effort is underway to find a Consumer Advocate who can pick up the excellent work begun by Dr Emmel. She called into the Council meeting to discuss possible options from her perspective. She discussed the efforts she initiated to encourage consumer advocates to become actively involved in USNC TAGs particularly for appliances and she highlighted several reasons why this is a very challenging target.

In an effort to report on an existing consumer program, Ms Sonya Bird, UL, provided an informative presentation on UL's activities in the consumer area. (USNC/Council 650) (ATTACHMENT L) She highlighted the following:

- Consumer Representation is not new...
- Why are Consumers Important to Standardization?
- Consumer Representative Solicitation
- Consumer Representative Tools
- Consumer Representative Training
- Consumer Representative "Feel-Goods"
- Real Results Standardization
- Consumer Representative Entitlements
- Even with Perks, Participation is Low
- Consumer Representative Solicitation
- Other Consumer Tools Offered by UL

During discussion, Ms Elisabeth George, offered the following ideas for consideration:

- 1) What about people from our own industries or companies to act as a consumer on a different standard since we are consumers?
- 2) What about college kids? Start as a consumer rep and then potentially move into young and emerging professionals.
- 3) What about National Guard? Many are in the Guard for economic reasons so this could be opportunity to help them economically and get consumer insights.

## Section 16 Communications and Continuing Education Committee Megan A Hayes, NEMA, Vice Chair, C&CEC

Ms Megan Hayes, Vice Chair of the USNC Communications and Continuing Education Committee (C&CEC), reported that the Committee held its last meeting/teleconference on 13 January 2015. She highlighted the following:

### Section 17 CANENA (Council for Harmonization of the Electrical Standards of the Nations of the Americas (T P McNeive)

Mr McNeive noted that this year's CANEAN Annual Meeting will be held in 25 – 26 February 2015 in San Jose, Costa Rica.

### Section 18 FINCA (Forum of the IEC Full Members of the Americas – Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Mexico and US)

Mr Piqueira reported that the last FINCA meeting was held in Santiago, Chile on 16-17 October with the US serving as Chair and Chile as Secretary and Host. Efforts are continuing to draft the USNC's Mentoring Program with Chile and input from Mr Victor Ballivian is expected. As part of this meeting an excellent and informative Workshop on Conformity Assessment was facilitated by Mr Steve Margis, CAPCC Vice Chair. The next FINCA meeting is scheduled for Colombia in 2015.

#### **Section 19** Review of Council Standing Committees

Mr Zegers noted that, according to the USNC's Statutes, the Council must, each year, endorse the membership of the Council's Standing Committees. He called attention to document USNC Council 644 (ATTACHMENT N) invited the Council's endorsement. The document was approved by Motion.

#### Section 20 ANSI Interface
