Over time, the NSSN has evolved from its original intended use: to serve as a (1) source of bibliographic information about standards and (2) pointer to standard developers.

connecting those who need standards to those who can provide them.

Benefits

- The NSSN provides . . .
 - Ability to better orchestrate U.S. government agency, industry, consumer and academic efforts in global standardization
 - Strategic identification of which committees are working on which standards
 - Ability to determine what other standards are similar to, or referenced by, those standards that are critical to a specific program area
 - Easier integration of internal and external standards and related information




Product Description



- □ The NSSN is a free, web-based information service sponsored by the American National Standards Institute
 - Serves as a single point to search for information on approved standards
 - Facilitates direct electronic access to standards (when available)
 - Provides contact information on domestic and international standards development activities



Functionality



- Search capabilities and summary results
- □ Access and functionality for Network Site License Customers (such as university libraries)
- Cross-references to regulatory documents
- Expanded summary results about standards developing organizations



Collections

- □ Comprehensive source for status/availability information on more than 250,000 approved standards
 - National

- Regional
- International
- Foreign
- Sophisticated search mechanisms
- Bibliographic data, including scopes or abstracts (when provided by developer)
- Regular updates by the developing organizations



Document Access



- Seamless link to ANSI Online Electronic Standards Store (ESS) for electronic copies of hundreds of American National Standards (ANS) and ISO standards (including ISO 9000 and ISO 14000)
- ☐ Links to the web sites of standards developers when an electronic copy is available
- □ Contact information for obtaining documents that are only available in hard copy




Search Functions

- Search using all words, any words, or search for a phrase





Network Site License (continued)




One-step access to document downloads is available directly from the search summary results page.

Most documents are delivered in a nonrevisable .pdf format.





Cross-Referencing

- □ References to voluntary standards in the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR)
- □ Information includes document number and title, text of the reference, and section of CFR where document is referenced

CFR data referenced within scope.




Information About Standards Developers

- Pre-defined list of ANSI-accredited standards developers and ANSI-accredited Technical Advisory Groups





Standards Tracking & Automated Reporting (STAR) Service



- ☐ STAR is a fee-based component of the NSSN
 - Users establish profiles for projects of interest
 - Service automatically tracks changes in status of in development, revision or maintenance
 - Provides information about new standards in an area of interest
 - E-mail summary notifies user of updates
 - User's personal web page catalogues details of the modification



STAR Service

- □ Alerts can be narrow (i.e., one standard) or broad (i.e., an entire industry)
- Convenient way to track current activity and versions of standards you use
 - Automatic tracking of product areas
 - Notification of changes in external documents that are integral to your products
 - Notification of draft standards and committee drafts at ISO and others
