Hazardous Materials: Suspension of HMR Amendments Authorizing Transportation of Liquefied Natural Gas by Rail

Published 11/8/2021 Reference ISO PHMSA, in coordination with the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA), proposes to a mend the Hazardous Materials Regulations to suspend authorization of liquefied natural gas (LNG) transportation in rail tank cars pursuant to a final rule published in July 2020, pending the earlier of either completion of a separate rulemaking under RIN 2137-AF54 evaluating potential modifications to requirements governing rail tank cartransportation of LNG, or June 30, 2024. Comments must be received by December 23, 2021. To the extent possible, PHMSA will consider late-filed comments as a final rule is developed.

Pursuant to the Privacy Act of 1974, the National Credit Union Administration (NCUA) gives notice of a new proposed Privacy Act system of records. This system will maintain information collected in response to a public health emergency, such as a pandemic or epidemic, from NCUA personnel, including political appointees, employees, contractors, detailees, consultants, interns, volunteers, and applicants for Federal employment. This system will store information pertaining to individuals in the performance of the NCUA's statutory duties. This new system of record is applicable on November 12, 2021. The routine uses in this new system of record are applicable 30 days after publication, unless the NCUA makes changes based on comments received.
