



2004 WTO & Member Priorities Survey (III)

- Top 3 Obstacles to Progress Identified:
 - Government Protectionism (central & local)
 - Industry Protectionism
 - Lack of Access to Rulemaking Process



Specific Industry Concerns with China's Standards Regime

- Protectionism
 - Customs-level enforcement versus national treatment/non-discrimination
 - Potential for strong-arm tactics vis-à-vis IPR
- Access & Transparency
 - Mechanisms for foreign participation in standards-setting processes
 - Timely notification and translation
 - Meaningful public comment



Specific Industry Concerns with China's Standards Regime (II)

- Interagency Coordination in Implementing CCC Mark
 - Multiple and serial certification
 - HS codes and training of Customs officers
 - Redundant certification at component, subassembly, and finished product levels
