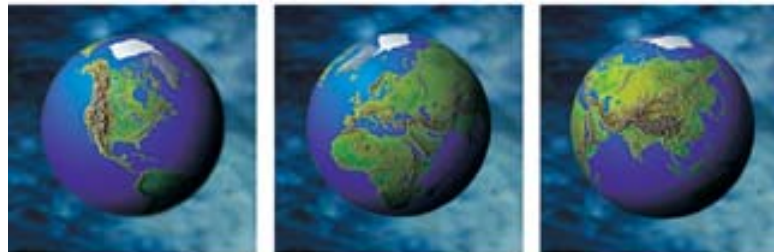

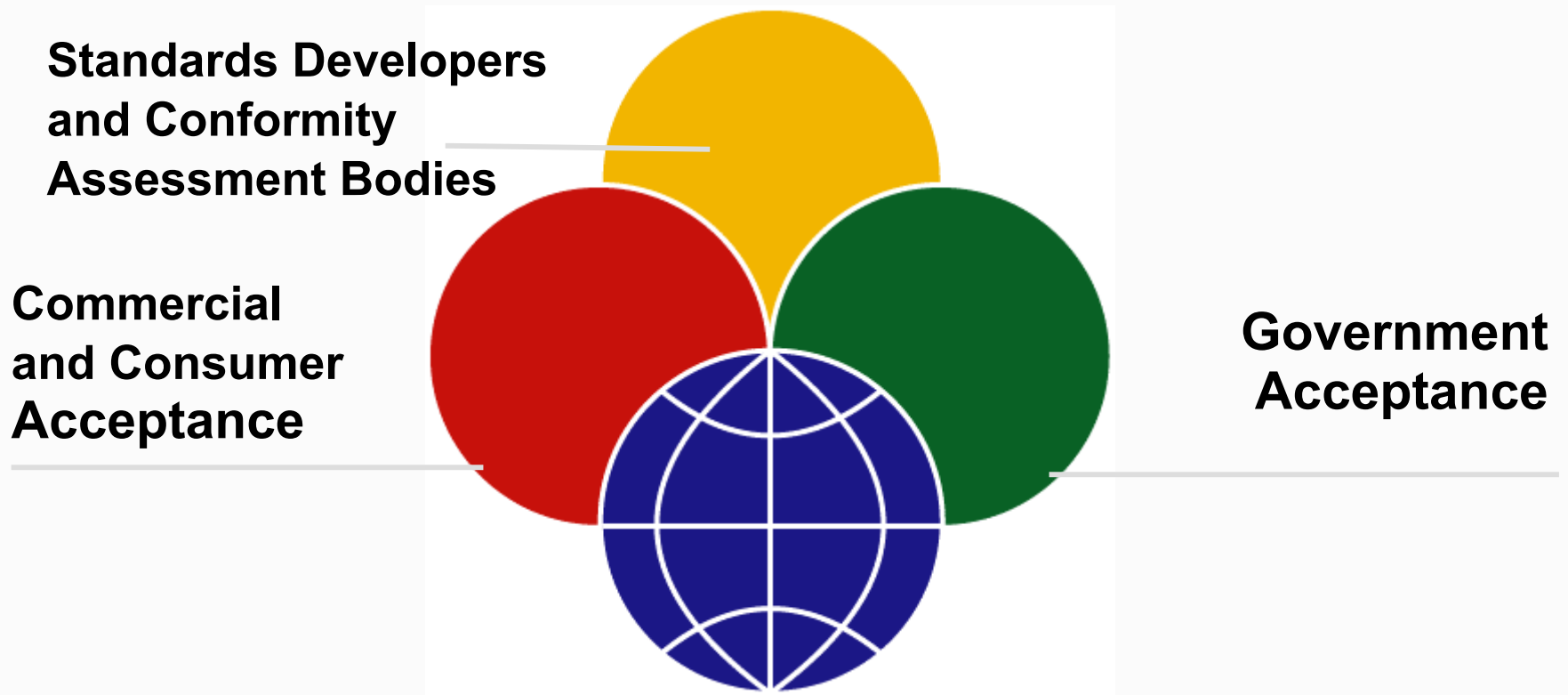

 - International Accreditation Forum (IAF)

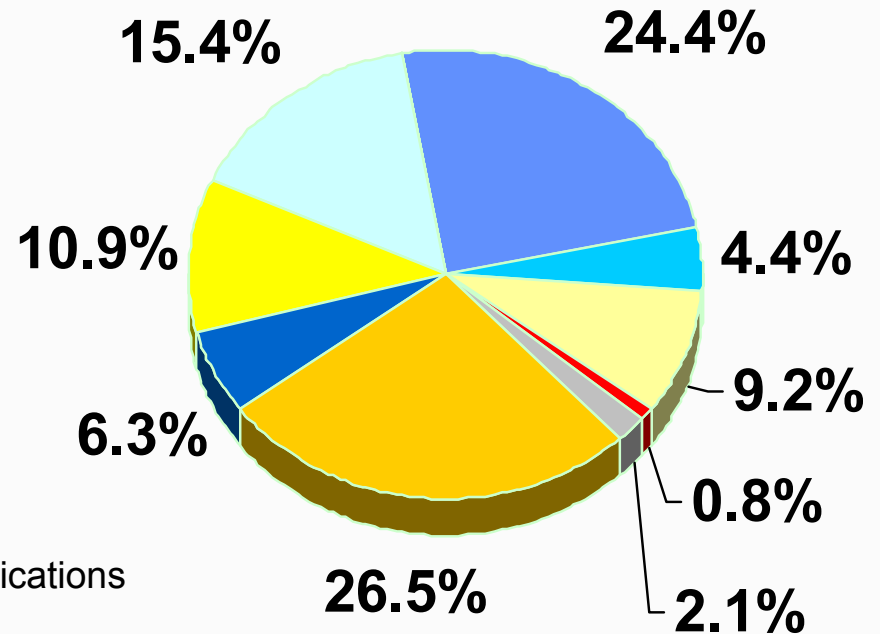
ISO Standards Development

 - Inter-American Accreditation Cooperation (IAAC)
 - Pacific Accreditation Cooperation (PAC)
- The Institute holds an annual dialogue with representatives of the European Standards Organizations (CEN, CENELEC and ETSI) and the European Commission
- ANSI also has formal agreements of cooperation with Argentina, Canada, China and Korea

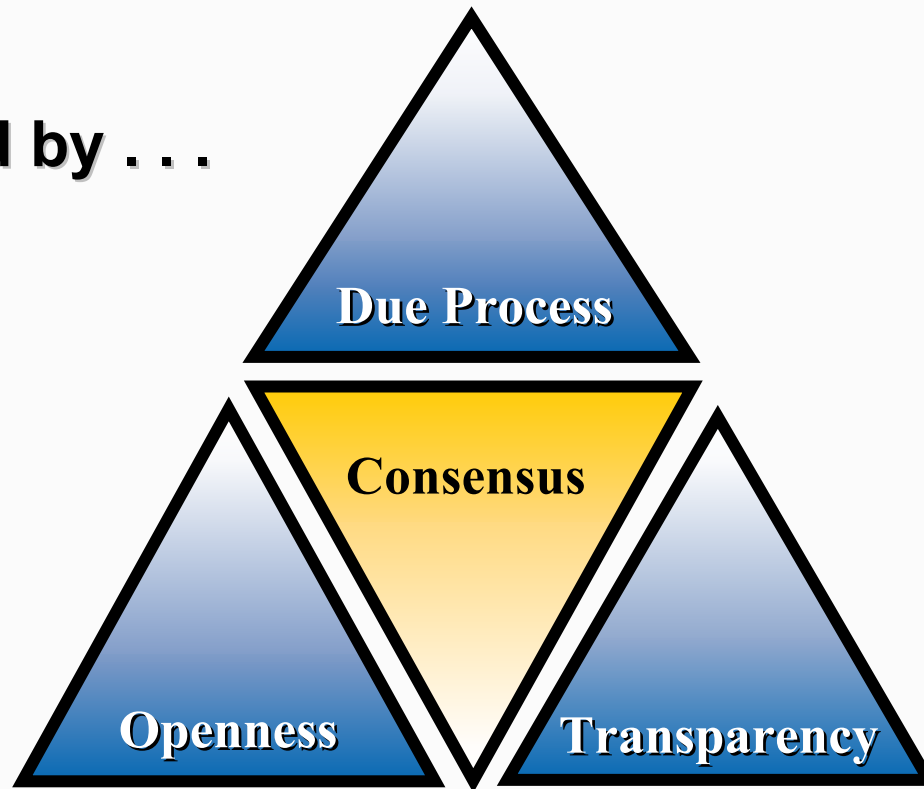
Internationally Accepted Standards and Conformity Assessment Principles

Objective: 1 Standard / 1 Test / 1 Acceptance



In a global marketplace, the objective of the standardization process must be a single, technically valid and globally relevant standard with a single test of conformance to that standard.

This will allow products to be distributed for worldwide commerce without change or modification.

“One Standard – One Test - Accepted by All”

Definition of terms



Conformity Assessment

“Activity that provides demonstration that specified requirements relating to a product, process, system, person or body are fulfilled”

Definition of terms, continued...

Certification

“Third party attestation related to products, processes, systems or persons”

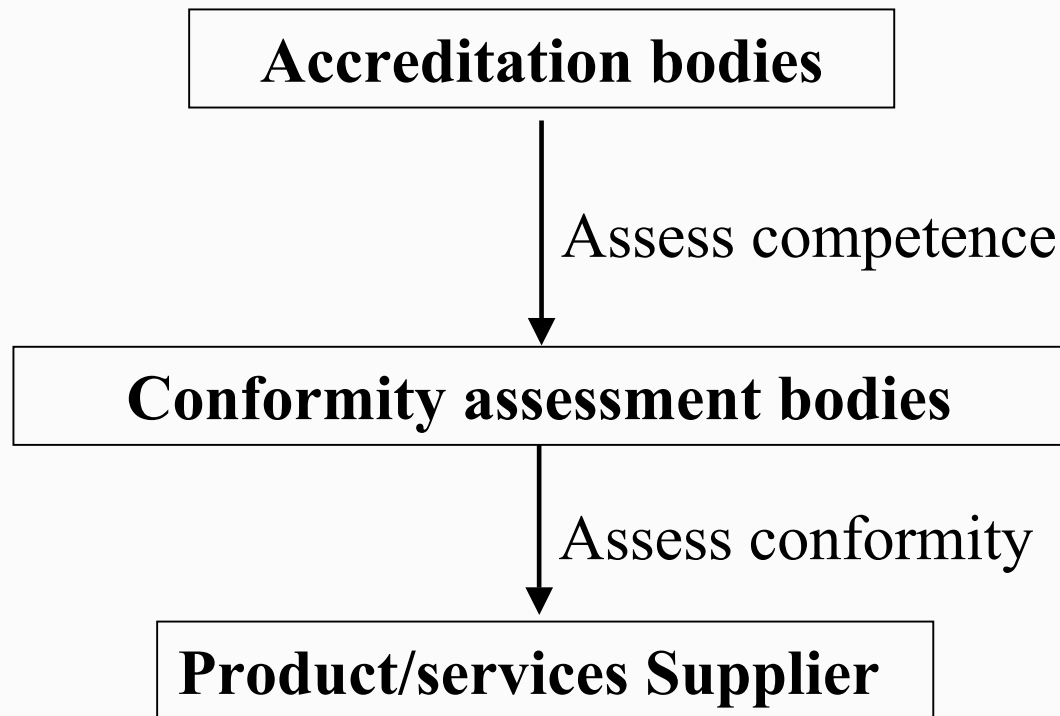
Accreditation

“Third party attestation that a conformity assessment body fulfills specified requirements and is competent to carry out specific conformity assessment tasks”



ISO/IEC Standard 17011

(Replacing ISO/IEC Guide 61 for accreditation bodies)

- Facilitates trade globally and eliminates barriers
- Builds confidence and reduces risk for customers
- Responsive to uniqueness of local culture
- Fosters development of robust schemes in emerging economies

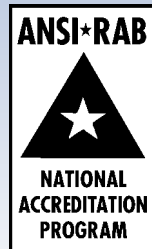

ISO/IEC FDIS 17011

(General requirements for assessment and accreditation of certification/ registration bodies)

4.3.5 The accreditation body shall ensure that each decision on accreditation is taken by **competent persons**...

6.1.1 The accreditation body shall have a sufficient number of **competent personnel**...having the education, training, technical knowledge, skills and experience necessary...

ISO/IEC DIS 17024

(General requirements for bodies operating certification schemes for persons)

4.3.1 ...methods and mechanisms to be used to evaluate the **competence of candidates**,

5.1.1 ...the certification process shall define the **competence** requirements for employed or **contracted persons** involved in the certification process.

5.2.1 **Examiners** shall meet the requirements of the certification body based on applicable **competence** standards...



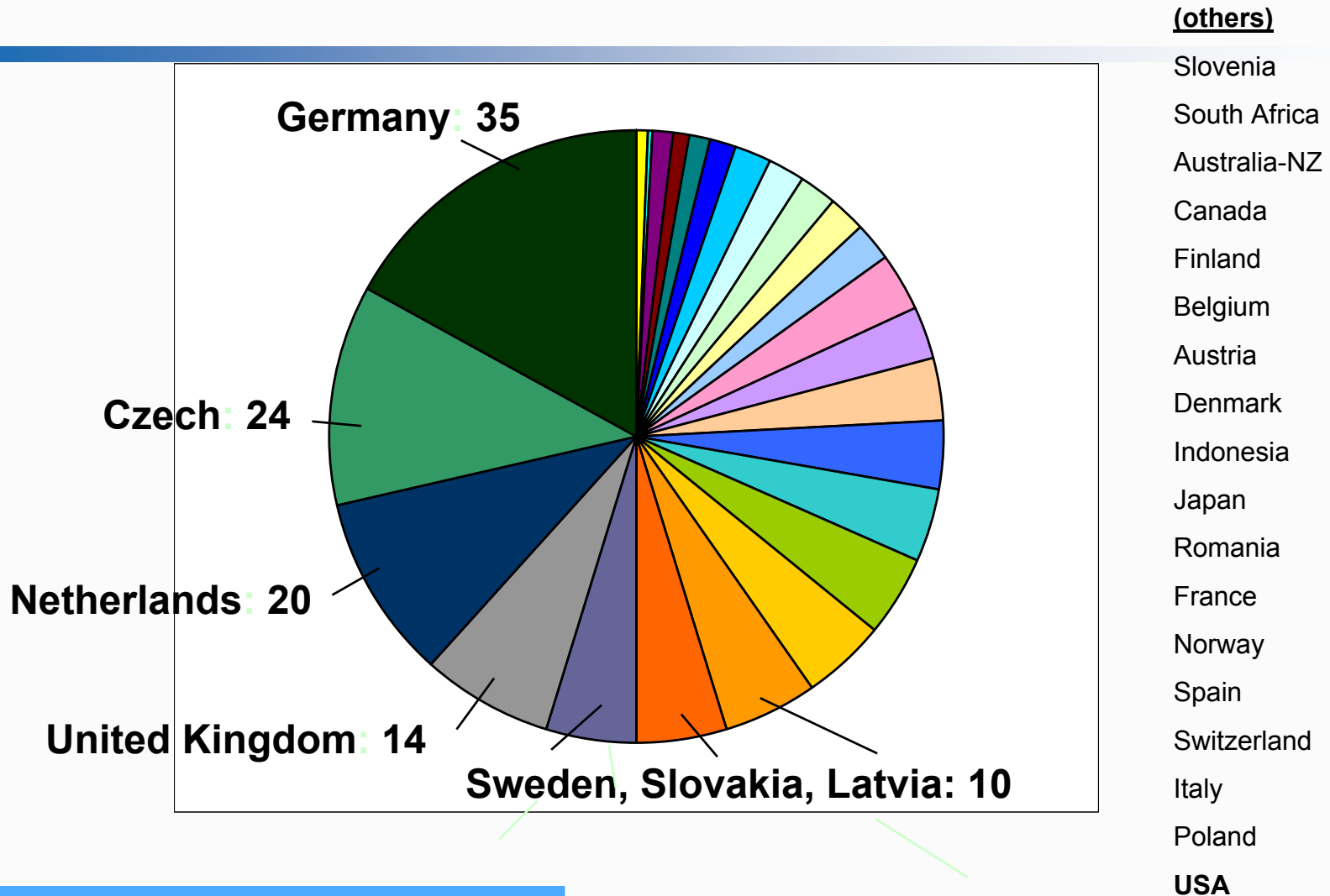

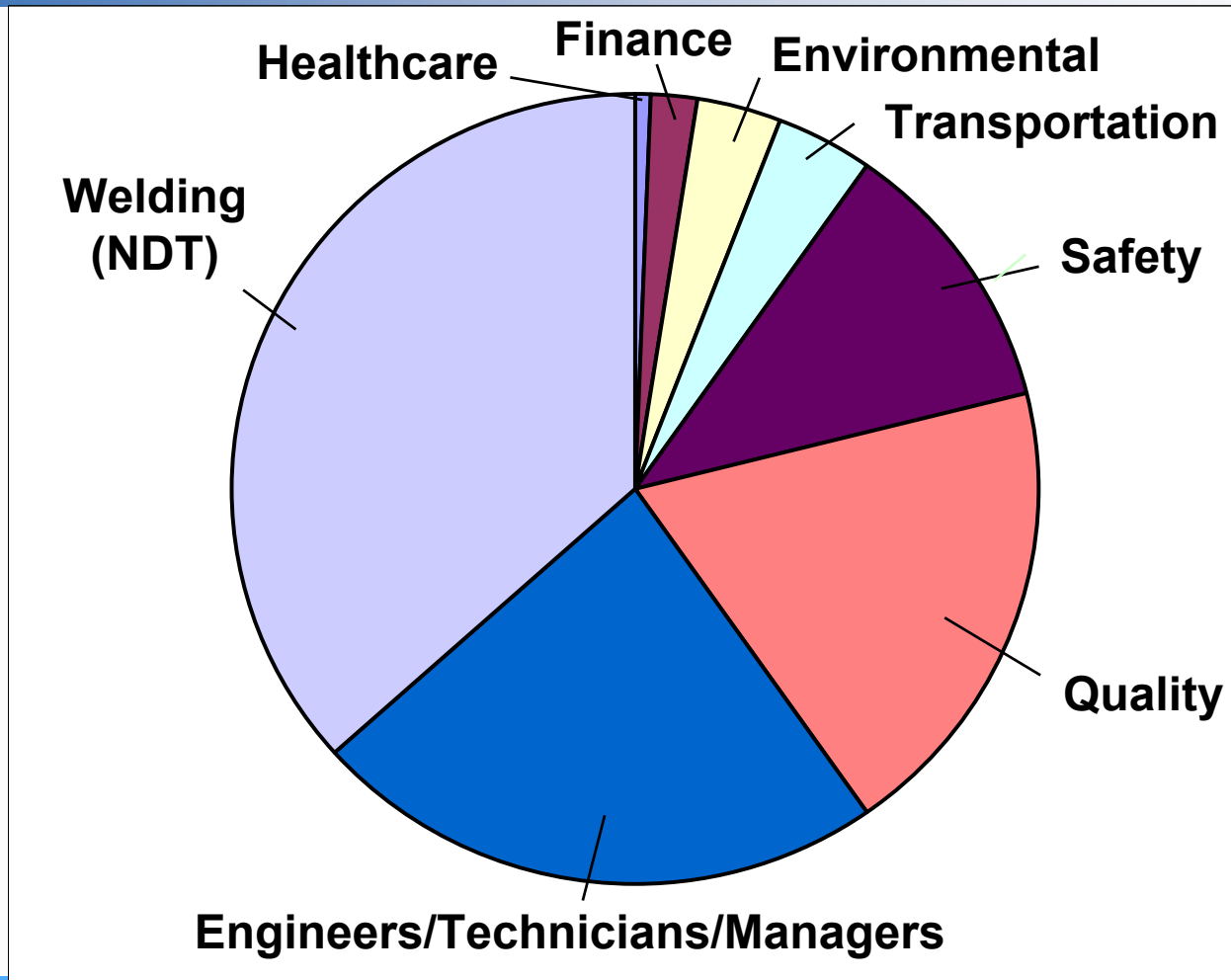


Accredited Certification Bodies

Summary

- The competence of people is a pivotal factor in the creation and delivery of goods and services

- Standards (such as ISO 17024) and Conformity Assessment (especially Accredited Certification Programs) can provide assurance to the marketplace
