





Why Members Join


CCX Baseline Emissions Greater than Largest EU National Allocation Plan

Size of Live, Emerging, Possible GHG Trading Markets






GHG Mitigation By CCX Members 2003 - 2008* (metric tons CO₂)

A National Carbon Constraint – Scenarios in Play

Congress driven

- 2009 Waxman-Markey bill passes in House of Representatives
- 2010 Senate contemplates options
 - Energy bill?
 - EPA time out?



A National Carbon Constraint – Scenarios in Play

- **EPA driven** (prompted by 2007 Supreme court decision)
 - 2010 GHG emissions reporting rule
 - 2011 EPA motor vehicle standards take effect
 - 2011 EPA large stationary source requirements take effect
 - Best Available Control Technology to be applied
