Recasting growth opportunities for ANSI.

- Through Standards Panels, and other fora, ANSI has taken on issues requiring involvement by ANSI members from all parts of the Federation: SDO's, government members, organizations, consumer groups, etc.
- Provide problem-solving capacity when both private and public sector involvement is necessary to achieve resolution
- Seek opportunities to offer neutral, expert facilitation to resolve issues that require consensus-driven solutions
- Assert ANSI's unique role as a 'quasi'



Finding Solutions Before the Problems Dictate the Response







An interconnected world requires an ecumenical approach to be successful; unresolved problems attract draconian solutions.

- Industries with standards and conformance-based issues need to be pro-active to avoid regulatory resolution
- Neither industry alone nor government alone is creditable in an interconnected world to provide solution sets; consensus is king
- The ANSI Federation may be unique in the size and scope of its footprint. How can we leverage this opportunity?



Build Consumer Confidence







Strengthen consumer confidence in the underlying health and safety of products sold in the United States.

- Facilitate the representation of consumer interests in standardization activities
- Promote improved consumer product safety
- Form partnerships to address the needs of the supply chain



Strengthening our Impact in Government "The Washington Plan"







ANSI's reputation of developing practicable (and consensusdriven) solutions to difficult issues resonates well in our tough economic times and with the new faces in Washington

- We have a record of problem solving; whether import safety, the environment, security issues or Health IT
- We are recognized by policymakers as a respected (and neutral), resource for information, expertise and solutions
- Our role as facilitator and convener allows us to reach into the ANSI Federation for the resources needed to populate the public-private partnerships that will drive solutions



Reaching Out to the Congress and the Administration







- In a period of financial stress and budget constraints, our message to the Administration and the Congress is that for many public policy issues- the private sector offers solutions that are "Faster, Cheaper and Better"
- Over the past two years we have been actively involved in policymaking exercises on:
 - Global Supply Chains
 - Energy Issues
 - Healthcare, Smart Grid, Cybersecurity, Innovation Strategies, Cookstoves (among others...)
- The message to Congress and the Administration is that ANSI can convene (and they will come...); can problemsolve ("consensus-based"); and can deliver solutions (practicable, transparent and viable).
