

Performance Alignment



Disney strives to use industry standards wherever possible. In those cases where Disney specific requirements cannot be met by industry, Disney uses the following classification of documents to define the requirements. These documents are generated using the process illustrated on page 2.

Guiding Principle (GPR)

Key philosophies, intentions, decisions and leadership direction on topics that have not been fully developed

Standard (STD)

Detailed requirements of *what* is required and expected to accomplish the intended objective. Standards typically including minimum design criteria, required methodologies and processes.

Business Practice (BPR)

Policies, procedures, work instructions and business methods defining *how* to accomplish business unit objectives.

Specification (SPC)

Qualitative requirements for products, instructions or other pertinent information necessary for fabrication, construction and workmanship

Bulletins(GBLT)

Safety related communications including Notifications, Safety Alerts and Service Bulletins




