




What is NFPA 1600?



- Is not a "how-to" guide
- An enterprise wide program that includes the necessary elements and management necessary for effective emergency management and business continuity/continuity of operations
- WHAT needs to exist in the program, not HOW to achieve it, therefore it is not prescriptive.
- The mandatory requirements are spelled out in only 3 pages!


15 Years Document History

- 2004 Updated Standard Published in April 2nd Edition
- 2007 Scheduled Publication for 3rd Edition
