#### DG HOME A: Internal Security I – Explosives Detection



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- The Action Plan on Enhancing the security of Explosives of 2008 recommends to develop minimum detection standards based on relevant detection scenarios and threat assessment
- The relevant scenarios are currently being developed by an expert working group consisting of representative of MS
- The expert working group is supported by a network of experts for the detection of explosives contracted by DG HOME.
- This Network provides support and technical advice to the Commission services in the area of explosives detection
- EC (joint activity: DG MOVE, DG HOME) is considering to develop generic guidelines for canine detection based on the experience in the aviation security



#### DG HOME A: Internal Security II



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- These generic recommendations could then be applied in other relevant areas
- Through one of the DG HOME financial programmes small scale funding for CEN standardisation work has been provided over the last few years in a couple of areas, such as:
  - critical infrastructure protection,
  - Biosafety / biosecurity,
  - security of drinking water
- In the future and in the context of the EU CBRN Action Plan it is planned to carry out similar activities, in particular on sampling, detection, etc.



# DG HOME A: Internal Security III – Further Activities



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- DG HOME supports the ERN-CIP project lead by the JRC, as presented in the ISG on security industry policy.
- DG HOME supports as well the ITRAP+10 project lead by the JRC which looks into the testing and certification of nuclear detection equipment and <u>already provides a cooperation element</u> <u>with the US</u>
- CIPS: Prevention, preparedness and consequence management of terrorism and other security-related risks, Endorsed by the Council in Dec 2009

# In asylum:

- framework of practical co-operation plus Eurodac and Dublin Convention, and in the Global approach to migration (Mobility Partnerships),
- for visas: the Visa Information System (VIS).
- Schengen Information System (SIS).
- for irregular immigration:
  - ICONet (Decision 2005/267/EC),
  - the Immigration Liaison Officers (Reg. 377/2004/EC) and
  - the Rapid Border Intervention Teams (Reg. 863/2007)

# On integration:

 framework of the Common Basic Principles (JHA Council conclusions of 19 Nov 2004)



#### DG HOME B & C: Migration, Asylum, Borders, Schengen III



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- In the context of the work of FRONTEX and the Schengen Border Code:
  - more relevant work carried out but for the time being not too interesting for industry
  - a more industry relevant discussion of technical interoperability standards in the area of EUROSUR, but it is still at a very early stage
- The same applies to the entry/exit and registered traveller programmes
- In these areas we can expect more work on technical interoperability standards in the near future
