Decisions taken at SMB meeting 171 held virtually on 2021-07-07/08

#### SMB Decision 171/1 – Revised SMB agenda

SMB approved the revised agenda as amended and given in document SMB/7325B/DA.

## SMB Decision 171/2 – TC/SC/SyC reports and SBPs

SMB, by consent:

- <u>approved</u> 27 reports, including SBPs, from TC/SC/SyCs, listed in Annex A of the decision list; and
- <u>expressed appreciation</u> to the Chairs and Secretaries of all the TC/SC/SyCs for the reports submitted.

Comments made by SMB members during the comment/approval process have been submitted directly to the TC/SC/SyCs concerned.

#### SMB Decision 171/3 – ahG 88 Covid induced consequences

SMB <u>thanked</u> Vimal Mahendru for presenting the work done by ahG 88 on Covid induced consequences.

SMB <u>noted</u> that all recommendations had been approved and <u>asked</u> Central Office to follow up in a timely manner on their implementation, taking into account the ongoing work in the SMB/TMB Joint Task Force on New Normal.

SMB <u>thanked</u> the Convenors and members of ahG 88 for their work and <u>disbanded</u> the ahG.

#### SMB Decision 171/4 – ahG 90 Prioritization of SMB work and performance/success measurement of technical work

SMB <u>thanked</u> Kareen Riley-Takos and Beer Opatsuwan for providing an overview of the work achieved by ahG 90 on the assessment of technical work and prioritization of SMB activities.

SMB <u>noted</u> that all recommendations had been approved and <u>asked</u> Central Office to follow up on the implementation of a dashboard incorporating the initial metrics proposed by ahG 90, taking into account the comments made by SMB members. The dashboard <u>will be presented</u> subsequently to SMB for further discussion and feedback.

SMB thanked the Convenors and members of ahG 90 for their work and disbanded the ahG.

## SMB Decision 171/5 – ahG 91 IEC Strategic Plan and Operational Plan

SMB <u>thanked</u> Vimal Mahendru and Han Xiao for providing an update on the activities of ahG 91 and <u>looks forward</u> to the progress being made by the Strategic Planning Task Force (SPTF).

## SMB Decision 171/6 – SG 12 Digital Transformation and Systems Approach

SMB <u>thanked</u> Oliver Hateley for his presentation on the work done by SG 12, and more specifically on the IEC SMART Standards Concept, which has been approved as a basis for continued work within SG 12.

SMB <u>noted</u> that Council Board had decided in its last meeting to set up a Task Force in response to the SG 12 recommendation to address the resource, commercial, legal and member implications of the IEC SMART Standards Concept. SMB <u>encouraged</u> an appropriate representation of SG 12 in this Task Force. SMB also <u>acknowledged</u> that the Task Force would coordinate the active collaboration with the ISO Council Steering Group on SMART. SMB further <u>noted</u> that this collaboration would be carried out in close coordination with SG 12.

SMB <u>recognized</u> the importance to support the implementation of the SMART Standards Concept through proof of concepts and pilots.

#### SMB Decision 171/7 – SEG 9 Smart Home/Office Building Systems

SMB thanked Gilles Thonet for reporting on the work done by SEG 9.

SMB <u>agreed</u> to include a potential description in the Directives for the possibility of creating Joint Advisory Groups (JAGs) but <u>insisted</u> on the need for the corresponding process to be as less prescriptive as possible and on the opportunity to align with ISO. SMB therefore <u>asked</u> Central Office to coordinate with ISO Central Secretariat on the principle of JAGs, after which JDMT <u>will be requested</u> to propose any corresponding provision for inclusion in the ISO/IEC Directives.

On the migration of the Strategic Business Plan (SBP) process to a digital format with revised content, SMB <u>welcomed</u> this recommendation but <u>noted</u> that the SBP template had recently been updated and that further work would be required before implementation. The specific elements suggested by SEG 9 <u>will be considered</u> as input to the next general review of the SBP template.

Regarding the proposed IEC Committee Cooperation Toolbox, SMB <u>asked</u> Central Office to make it available to the Technical Officers for use whenever needed.

SMB thanked the Convenor and members of SEG 9 for their work and disbanded it.

#### SMB Decision 171/8 – SEG 10 Ethics in Autonomous and Artificial Intelligence Applications

SMB <u>thanked</u> Peter Lanctot for reporting on the work done by SEG 10.

SMB <u>acknowledged</u> that a refinement of the scope of the proposed Advisory Committee on Ethics in Standards (ACES) would be needed before making a final decision. SMB therefore <u>requested</u> SEG 10 to propose a revised scope, ensuring that it is not restricted to Autonomous and Artificial Intelligence Applications, that collaboration with ISO is included, and that comments made by SMB members, JTC 1 and ACOS are taken into account.

SMB further <u>tasked</u> Central Office to evaluate the interest from IEC Committees and their readiness to participate in the proposed ACES should it be created.

SMB also <u>confirmed</u> that the recommendation to complement existing standards for safety with a standard for ethical risk assessment had not been approved.

The recommendation for characterization of the environmental sustainability of Artificial Intelligence systems <u>is referred</u> to ACEA, TC 111, JTC 1/SC 39 and JTC 1/SC 42 for further consideration.

Regarding the additional recommendations for JTC 1, SMB <u>requested</u> SEG 10 to provide more information on what they meant by "digital sovereignty" and "overlapping jurisdictions". Using this additional information, SMB <u>will refer</u> these recommendations to JTC 1 for further consideration on how to implement them.

SMB <u>will make its final decision</u> on setting up the proposed ACES as well as on disbanding SEG 10 at its next meeting in October 2021.

### SMB Decision 171/9 – Report from the Standardization Division

SMB thanked Pierre Sebellin for his update on the technical work of the Standardization Division.

SMB <u>encouraged</u> the Standardization Division to take the necessary actions to bring down the percentage of late projects and <u>requested</u> further reports at subsequent SMB meetings.

#### SMB Decision 171/10 – TCs not submitting reports within 4 weeks of their meeting

SMB <u>noted</u> that TC 69 (BE) had failed to submit its report (RSMB) on time and <u>invited</u> the National Committee holding the secretariat to investigate.

#### SMB Decision 171/11 – Database Reference Group (DBRG)

SMB <u>thanked</u> Stephen Dutnall for his presentation of the work done by the Database Reference Group (DBRG).

Regarding the adoption of the proposed changes to Annex SL of the Directives, SMB <u>deferred</u> the decision until DMT completes its review and provides its recommendation to SMB.

SMB <u>noted</u> the urgency of this matter and <u>assigned</u> the advisory role on standards in database format to SG 12. Technical requirements for standards in database format outlined in the final DBRG report <u>are forwarded</u> to SG 12 for further consideration and discussion, in collaboration with ITAG and ISO.

On the question of licensing and commercial access mechanisms for standards in database format, SMB <u>noted</u> that this matter was outside its scope of responsibility and <u>asked</u> the Sales Advisory Group (SAG) to consider Annex F of the final DBRG report and make appropriate recommendations.

SMB thanked the DBRG for its work and requested Central Office to disband it.

#### SMB Decision 171/12 – Central Office and Council Board (CB)

SMB <u>thanked</u> Philippe Metzger for his update on Central Office activities as well as on the decision of Council Board to set up a Task Force on SMART Standards.

On the governance review work, SMB <u>noted</u> that the new Statutes and Rules of Procedure would be submitted to Council at the end of July 2021 for consideration and decision at the upcoming Council meeting.

#### SMB Decision 171/13 – Conformity Assessment Board (CAB)

SMB thanked Shawn Paulsen for his report on the last CAB meeting.

Following the concern expressed by CAB on the poor response from some TC/SCs to the delivery of Decision Sheets, SMB <u>encouraged</u> again TC/SCs to respond in a timely way to such requests and <u>tasked</u> Central Office to report the response rate and response time as part of the statistics of the technical work. SMB further <u>asked</u> Technical Officers to follow directly on these issues. Depending on this development SMB <u>will discuss</u> further steps as needed.

Regarding the conversion of the IEC 62443 series of standards into horizontal publications, SMB <u>asked</u> ACSEC to send a QP recommending the allocation of a horizontal function based on Item 7 in document SMB/7304/R, taking into account the comments made by SMB members.

In addition, SMB <u>noted</u> the interest of CAB to nominate an additional expert to the ACOS Task Force on Collaborative Safety and <u>encouraged</u> ACOS to process this request.

## SMB Decision 171/14 – ISO/TMB

SMB <u>thanked</u> Sauw Kook Choy for providing an update on ISO activities and <u>looks forward</u> to continuing the fruitful collaboration with ISO, in particular in the area of SMART standards.

## SMB Decision 171/15 – Date and place of next meetings

Acknowledging that the possibility to travel to Australia throughout the year to come was still uncertain, SMB <u>recognized</u> that planning for SMB meeting 173 in Sydney in February 2022 posed a number of challenges. As a consequence, SMB <u>requested</u> Central Office to make alternative arrangements for holding this meeting in Switzerland.

SMB <u>thanked</u> again the Australian National Committee for its offer to meet in February 2022 and <u>looks forward</u> to the next opportunity to meet in Sydney in the near future.
