Eicher Leadership Award.</p> <p>Executive summary: This agenda item will feature an informational report and presentation that may be regarded as generally non-controversial in nature. Under item 8.2, the Eicher Award for 2008 will go to ISO/TC 127 (Earth moving machinery) which is an ISO committee secretariat held and administered by ANSI. <p>9</p>	<p>The ISO Brand – A shared asset.</p> <p>Executive summary: The background paper for this ISO GA agenda item states that the ISO brand has gained considerable high level of recognition in the past decade. As a shared and valuable asset of the ISO members, the paper asserts that ISO members' actively involved in the protection and promotion of the ISO brand is indispensable. The wide reputation of the ISO brand has been built over more than 60 years of appreciated service to the world community, materialized by a current collection of more than 17000 ISO standards and publications. Adequate tools and actions have been put in place to assist them in so doing, which may be improved and expanded on the basis of actual use and experience. The supporting documents and the ISO GA presentation and discussion will focus on the following elements:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The notoriety of the ISO brand; 2. The legal protection of the ISO mark; 3. The protection of the copyright on ISO publications; 4. The use of the ISO name in relation to conformity assessment, in particular for certification of compliance to ISO management systems standards; 5. The use of the ISO name for communication and promotion purposes. <p>For information, ANSI has traditionally objected to the ISO Council decision that ISO members should bear the legal costs of defending the ISO brand in their countries. This has led to considerable expense to ANSI over the years.</p> <p>Recommended ANSI position: ANSI delegation is authorized to determine in Dubai any comments it wishes to make relative to this report.</p>

<p>11</p>	<p>Amendments to the ISO Statutes and Rules of Procedure.</p> <p>11.1 Venues of ISO General Assemblies. 11.2 Increase in the number of seats on ISO Council and the ISO Technical Management Board.</p> <p>Executive summary: The current provision of the ISO Statutes and Rules of Procedure dealing with the venues of General Assemblies stipulates that, “as a general aim, one in three meetings of the General Assembly should be held in the city of the seat of the Organization”. Experience has shown that General Assemblies are an important event for all ISO members in general, and for the ISO member body hosting the event in particular. It is a great opportunity to raise awareness of standardization in the country, and also in the corresponding region, at the highest levels. It is proposed that the that ISO Statutes and Rules of Procedure be amended to allow members to be able to invite for any given year that suits them without being limited by the current provision.</p> <p>At the September 2007 ISO Council meeting, a proposal was made by the ISO Officers to increase the number of seats on ISO Council by 2 (one from Group 1 and one from Group 4). As a result, a number of ISO Council members made counter-proposals on this question. At the March 2008 ISO Council meeting, this question was considered again and the ISO Council agreed that the number of seats on ISO Council should be increased from 18 to 20, with the number of seats from Group 1 and from Group 4 to be increased by one each.</p> <p>At the September 2007 ISO Council meeting, it was agreed that the number of seats on the ISO/TMB should be increased from 12 to 14, with the number of seats from Group 1 and from Group 2 to be increased by one each.</p> <p>Recommended ANSI position: ANSI supports the proposed amendments to the ISO Statutes and Rules of Procedure.</p>
