What the global trade requires from standardization

- More open markets
 - Standards remove technical obstacles
 - The effort towards global relevance
- More fluidity and security in the supply chain
 - The ISO maritime container for general use
 - Security management in the supply chain
 - Reliable data: electronic exchange, anti-counterfeiting...
- A contribution to sustainability
 - > ISO SR 26000, sustainability criteria...



International standardization, a level playing field

- Equal opportunity for all and in all countries
 - > To participate for producers, competition, users
 - In the process enquiries, validation, conflict management...
 - The concept of consensus overcoming objections through the understanding of concerns
 - In the application standards are voluntary
- Even when the issue seems primarily bi- or tri-lateral
 - Biofuels: US Brazil EU
 - Toys: US China EU



An unprecedented harmonization effort


One European standard ... Replaces 30 national standards in Europe

... Gives access to a market of 490 million







How many standards in Europe?



Yearly adoption of CEN documents identical to ISO




CEN harmonized standards identical to ISO – yearly adoption
