Steven Bipes Director – International Policy – Regional and Bilateral Programs American National Standards Institute (ANSI)

Steven Bipes is director of regional and bilateral policy in the International Department with the American National Standards Institute (ANSI), headquartered in Washington DC. In this role, Mr. Bipes is responsible for the coordination of ANSI policy and participation with other regional and national standardization and conformity assessment bodies, including the Pan American Standards Commission (COPANT) and its Board of Directors, the Pacific Area Standards Congress (PASC) and its Standing Committee, and the European Standardization Organizations (ESOs) of CEN, CENELEC and ETSI and their Joint Presidents Group. He is also responsible for coordinating Institute education and outreach efforts with the U.S. Foreign Commercial Service and foreign stakeholders on the impact of standards and conformity assessment programs to global trade.

Prior to joining ANSI in 2003, Mr. Bipes worked in the telecom, manufacturing, and software industries for more than 10 years. He served as a member of U.S. delegations to the NAFTA Consultative Committee for Telecommunications (CCT) and the Inter-American Telecommunication Commission (CITEL) under the Organization of American States. He was previously a member of the American Chamber of Commerce in Brazil (AMCHAM) in São Paulo. Mr. Bipes participated in the Telecommunication Industry Association's (TIA) Regulatory Engineering Committees, coordinating with the U.S. Federal Communication Commission (FCC) in the deregulation of its various programs, and participated in the harmonization of Canadian and U.S. technical telecommunications and electrical safety requirements.

Mr. Bipes started his professional career working in the Quality Assurance Department for Siemens-Nixdorf in Paderborn - Germany. He has since worked with multinationals in the United States and Brazil. He holds a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from Purdue University and is currently earning his Masters Degree in Public Policy at Georgetown University.

Elise Owen established and now runs a very active China Program for ANSI. She has been responsible for building and maintaining relations with ANSI's counterparts in China, and for instituting high-profile initiatives such as <u>www.standardsportal.org</u>. Dr. Ajit Jillavenkatesa is a Senior Standards Specialist with the Global Standards and Information Group (GSIG) at the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST). In this role, he tracks and analyzes standards and conformity assessment related policy issues in South Asia, Asia-Pacific and the Mid East Asia regions. His primary responsibilities include providing standards and conformity assessment related policy and technical expertise to customers at NIST, the U.S. Department of Commerce, other US Government agencies and the private sector. He thus interacts extensively with standards experts in addressing the role of standards and conformity assessment in enabling trade and commerce, and the manifestation of standards and conformity assessment procedures as technical barriers to trade. Dr. Jillavenkatesa also participates in standards development in emerging areas such as nanotechnology and radio-frequency identification (RFID) and tracks these issues and their global impact.

Dr. Jillavenkatesa is a materials scientist by training, having come to NIST in 1997, with a Ph.D. in Ceramics from Alfred University in New York. He has authored and co-authored books and peer reviewed publications related to physical and chemical characterization of materials.
