THE BUSINESS VISA CENTER (BVC)

The Business Visa Center's Role

The Business Visa Center (BVC), part of the State Department's Visa Services Office in Washington, D.C., assists businesses in the United States and their partners, customers and colleagues around the world by providing visa information. Whether at our more than 200 embassies or consulates abroad, or here in the United States, the Bureau of Consular Affairs supports business-related travel to the U.S. The BVC is one more way the Department of State actively promotes international business travel, U.S. commerce and the U.S. economy.

The BVC provides information about the application process for business (B-1) visa travel to the U.S. We can explain the visa process to U.S. companies that invite employees or current and prospective business clients and partners to the U.S. As part of the BVC's effort, we also offer information to U.S. conference and meeting organizers that expect a large number of foreign visitors to the U.S. Additionally, the BVC maintains a list of "Upcoming Conferences" to be held in the United States on our internal Department of State intranet site and invites U.S. organizers to provide this information to us.

What the Business Visa Center Cannot Do

The Business Visa Center cannot expedite interview appointments or the processing of visa applications. Additionally, we cannot guarantee the issuance of a visa or decide the merits of an application for a visa. The Consular Officer at the Embassy or Consulate overseas will make those decisions during the application process. Having an event listed on the Upcoming Conferences web page also does not guarantee visa approval.

About the Visa Application Process

It is important to understand some basic steps in the visa process. U.S. Embassies and Consulates have the responsibility under U.S. immigration law for the acceptance and processing of visa applications, and for decisions about issuance of visas to foreign citizens for travel to the U.S. The BVC cannot interfere in the visa process.

Improved information for businesses and the public, in the form of up-to-date details about wait times for interviews and visa processing times, is available on most embassy and consulate websites and at www.travel.state.gov. This information allows business travelers to better prepare for their interviews and plan their trips.
