Common Goals

- Improve the quality and effectiveness of Zambian regulations
- Ensure rigorous, consistent application of RIA steps and methodologies
- Achieve whole of government approach to RIA implementation
 - Socialization of **RIA benefits** (to government and private sector), **legal underpinnings**
- Commitment to continuous improvement



Defining Roles

- RIA team are interdisciplinary
- Clearly defined roles helps achieve goals more efficiently & effectively
- Specialization
- Knowing when to ask for help; willingness to help others
- Unity of purpose creates a virtuous cycle of continuous improvement



Core Competencies

- Evaluate tradeoffs between policy options
- Understand quantitative analysis
 - Ability to understand models that explain the market and effects of expected behavioral change
 - Ability to apply appropriate methodologies to analyze costs & benefits
- Understand legal underpinnings and limits of program being analyzed
- Understand basic statistical methods
 - Can be basic (average, mean, median)
 - Sample sizes and explanatory power



RIA Team Components

- Representative of BARRA
- Policy lead
- Economic expert
- Legal expert
- Statistical methods (all)
- Project manager
- Copy editor



Institutional Responsibilities

- Every team member responsible for success
- Maintain integrity of deliberative regulatory process
 - Adherence to ethical standards
 - Privileged and confidential information
 - Stakeholder engagement guidelines
- Ensure adherence to RIA guidelines (BRRRA Handbook)
 - Each team member “owns” responsibility
 - Sanctions and enforcement
- Socialization of RIA benefits & legal underpinnings



Centralized Review

- BRRRA, COFEMER, OIRA, Privy Council, etc.
 - Regulatory gatekeepers
 - Legal mandate
 - Political will
 - Often poorly resourced (lean management)
- Oversight of Inputs to Regulatory Decision Making
 - RIA process
 - Science & economic policy
 - Government research
 - Statistical policy
 - Public consultation



What does an effective RIA team look like?

- Specialized roles, interdisciplinary approach
- Understand the benefits of RIA and for whom
 - **Why** not just **how**
- RIA ambassadors of government wide success
- Own the RIA guidelines
- Understand how RIA mediates policy and politics
- Creators of a virtuous cycle
