

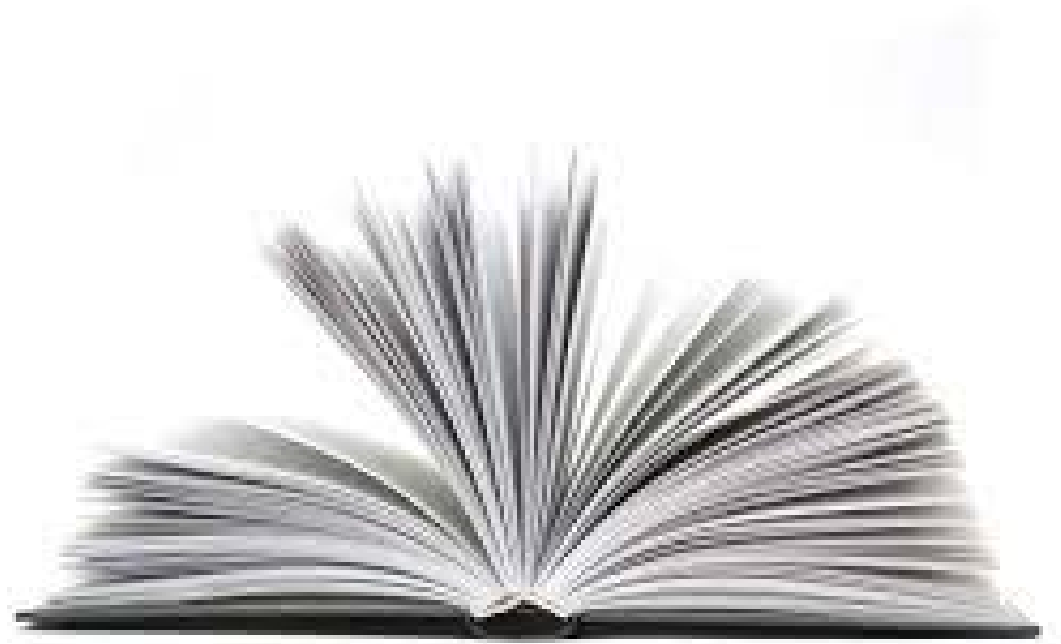

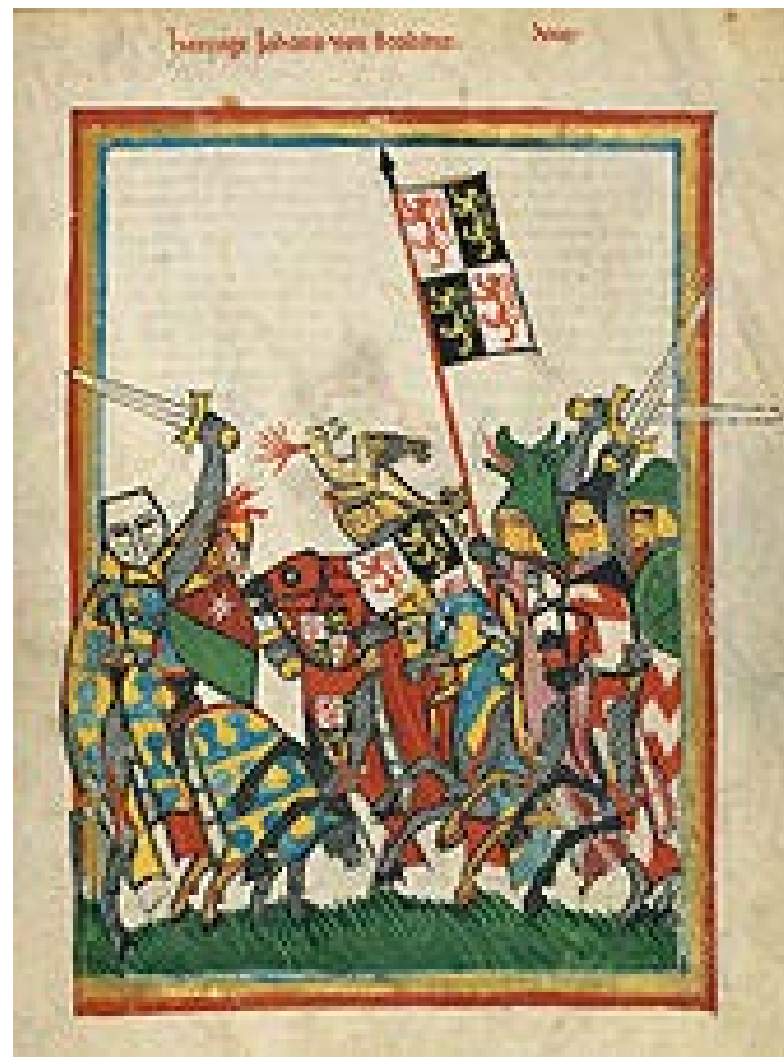

What is a standard?

The word *standard* itself is from an Old Frankish term for a field sign



What is a standard?

a document, established by consensus and approved by a recognized body, that provides, for common and repeated use, rules, guidelines or characteristics for activities or their results, aimed at the achievement of the optimum degree of order in a given context.

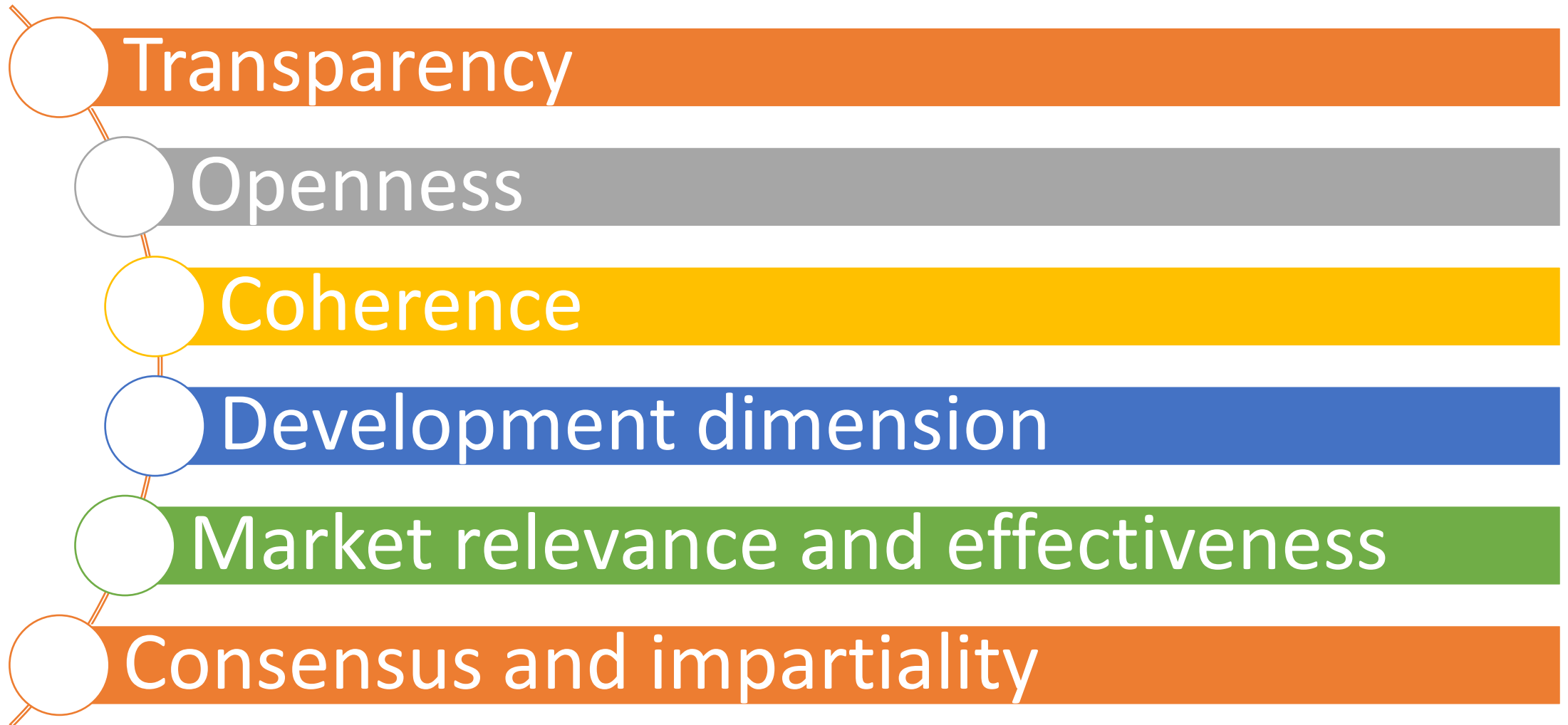

Steps in standards development

7		Approval and publication
6		Public review and notification
5		Technical committee stakeholder consensus
4		Developing a working draft
3		Idea approval, resource allocation, Technical committee allocation, planning
2		Evaluation, thinking, rationalising, imagining
1		Idea generation
