Activity Assessment Schedule

National Activity Assessment

The national activity assessment supports the American National Standards (ANS) process infrastructure and is based on the total number of American National Standards sponsored by the standards developer; this fee includes the costs associated with the mandatory routine audit applicable to all ANSI-accredited standards developers. The following formula applies:

International Activity Assessment

The international assessment has two components, each calculated separately, and is applied in addition to the full member dues of relevant members. The first component is applied to ANSI members that hold ISO, IEC, and/or JTC 1 secretariats. Assessments are based upon the number of ISO, IEC and/or JTC 1 Technical Committee (TC) and/or Subcommittee (SC) secretariats administered. The second component is applied to members that administer U.S. Technical Advisory Groups (TAGs). The assessments are based on the number ISO, IEC and/or JTC 1 TCs and/or SCs for which the organization administers a U.S./TAG (i.e., "P" memberships). (See also Note 3, below.)
